

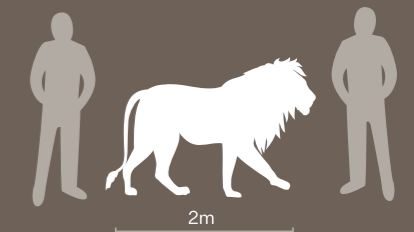
Sit at a distance, stand as one. Noho Tawhiti, Tū Kotahi
